Hello,

Yes, it has really been noticed that these keep spinning - in addition, EASA has already sent this out to the airlines so they have been executed to Swedavia's great misfortune. Costs a fortune to handle this. [I] do not know that ECDC will do anything together with EASA, but it may be a feasible way, although I do not think we can hope too much given what ECDC has written about the use of masks among the general public.

Tomorrow we will have a meeting with the Swedish Transport Agency to discuss common issues in this area. Several points of what EASA recommends are governed by Swedish legislation and go completely against our recommendations and legislation. It is also extremely interesting that there is such a focus on aviation (which hardly exists) when plenty of trucks and buses are rolling in across the countries' borders within Europe without any urging whatsoever for hand hygiene or fundamental hygiene measures.
